CLUB/CO-CURRICULAR PROGRAM
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ACADEMIC TEAM

- Advisors:** Mrs. Glus
Meetings: 1/week
Prerequisite: Students must take a battery of tests during early sessions of the club and place high in rank on these tests.
Club Activity: Students on the team represent South Plainfield High School in a “Jeopardy” type forum - usually held at various locations around the state. As well as some that are NAQT style tournaments that could qualify them for national standings. Students host a tournament to fund their activities in which they participate in every aspect of the preparation including the writing of questions.

ALGONQUIN SQUARE BOOK CLUB

Meetings: The last Friday of every month.
Prerequisite: None.
Club Activity: This group meets several times a year to discuss selected works of literature. Each month, the students choose a genre of books such as fantasy, science fiction, realistic fiction, biography, informational, etc. Students read a book of their choice, within the chosen genre, and attend the next meeting to discuss their books. Prerequisite:	Students in 11 th , or 12 th grade, must be enrolled in French 3 or higher, have a 3.3 average in French and a 3.0 overall GPA over a 3-semester period, as per French Honor Society (FHS) guidelines. Students, who are eligible, will be recognized by advisor for membership.
Club Activity:	French Honor Society members provide weekly tutoring each Tuesday at 2:30PM as per teacher's request and work in conjunction with the French Club on various community service projects. FHS provides an opportunity to recognize outstanding ability in the study of French language through selection for membership, the placement of a special seal on the graduate's diploma, the wearing of a white cord at graduation, and the right to wear the official emblem/pin of the honor society. The chapter provides a vehicle for focusing activities around French language and literature and also for encouraging member participation in the annual writing contest as well as application for the annual travel grants. In addition, there is the opportunity for students to experience leadership in serving as officers, directing the initiation ceremony, and/or leading other chapter events.

Day trips to places of historical interest are taken twice a year and a three day, two-night trip is taken in the spring. Meetings:	For all members: Monday, Wednesday, and Friday of the marching season. For Color Guard: Monday, Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday of the marching season. Monday and Wednesday rehearsals take place from 5:30-8:30PM and Friday rehearsals take place from 2:45-5:00PM.
Prerequisite:	For Marching Band: No audition necessary. For Color Guard: Students must audition. For both groups: Willingness to participate in all rehearsals and performances.
Club Activity:	The Marching Band and Color Guard perform at football games, at various school and community functions, and in parades, concerts, and USSBA competitions throughout the school year. The Color Guard consists of the Flag, Dancer, and weapons (rifle and saber).

MATH TEAM

- Prerequisite:** Students must have the recommendation of their math teacher.

- Club Activity:** Students debate current events in the world today by representing the viewpoints of different countries. Topics range and include issues such as: The War on Terror, AIDS/HIV in Africa, the United Nations Millennium Development Goals, and the Sudanese Refugee Crisis. Students will research their topics and assigned countries to prepare themselves for conferences in which they will debate with students from other high schools. In the past, SPMUN students have traveled to Boston, Washington DC, New York City, and Rutgers University. Other activities include fundraisers, guest speakers on careers in international relations, and our trip to the United Nations.

The Team’s objective is to foster a love for STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics), as well as build upon authentic 21st Century skills for students to become technological leaders in our community and beyond. “The varsity Sport for the Mind™, FRC® combines the excitement of sport with the rigors of science and technology. Under strict rules of the competition, limited resources, and time limits, teams of students are challenged to raise funds, design a team "brand," hone teamwork skills, and build and program robots to perform prescribed tasks against a field of competitors.
